As per the Pukehou School Health & Safety Policy, in Terms 1 & 4 it is compulsory for



all children to wear regulation hats whilst outside.

“From the beginning of Term 4 to the end of Term 1, while exposed to the sun, students are required to wear clothing that protects skin from the sun (eg collars, sleeves and no singlets). As well, students are required to wear broad brimmed (min 7.5 cms) legionnaire or bucket hats (min 6 cm brim) when they are outside eg interval, lunch, sport, excursions and activities.

Parents/staff /visitors will be seen to act as positive role models by practicing SunSmart behaviors including wearing appropriate hats and clothing for all outdoor activities.”
