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Celebration is in order: Mid Year Achievement Data

At Monday's Board of Trustees meeting our staff presented Pukehou's mid year achievement data on the core curriculum areas of Reading, Writing and Maths. The Board have asked for this to be shared with the community to celebrate the wonderful achievements of our students and staff. Finding a balance between growing our students academic achievements and their personal health and wellbeing has been a path that we have been working on over the last three years and will continue in the years to come. Our mid year data shows significant improvements in our students academic achievement, despite the recent interruption COVID-19 caused, these results are well above the New Zealand average. We are please to report:

Our staff continue to work in the Accelerating Learning in Literacy programme in 2020, with our main focus on Writing. Our involvement in this programme in 2019 saw a significant shift in the number of students reading above their chronological age, we look forward to seeing a similar impact in our students writing results. Well done to all our tamariki and dedicated staff!
