This way they are close to the action for the sprints and can concentrate on supporting their houses. As part of a meeting I was in on Wednesday, the subject of the election in USA came up and I thought I would share a few thoughts from the discussion with you. I think we would all agree that it has been a hugely divisive experience for Americans, and as is the nature of politics there, based so much on personality rather than policy. It could be argued that both candidates were flawed and carried a lot of baggage and perhaps neither were a great choice.

As part of Kāhu Camp last week our Year 7 and 8's went to visit Parliament and saw where democracy is centred in NZ. At times we can also say that much of our politics too is at least 'vigorous' in the way it is carried out. The New Zealand Curriculum has Key Competencies which are skills that we are expected to teach our children. They are thinking, relating to others, using language, symbols and texts, managing self and participating and contributing. At Pukehou School we use the Habits of Mind which offer a greater skill set. Both tools though are about helping to teach our children to be able to work with others, and be inclusive, something that seems to fly in the face of what we see in Politics and more often, on social media. It's interesting too that while it is a part of the NZ Curriculum, these skills don't figure in what is deemed as being of urgency, namely literacy and numeracy data.

I guess I have always held on to the belief that in teaching our children those skills, we are giving them tools to work with others in positive ways as they grow older and that hopefully society in future may be a little less combative than it is now.
