Health Consultation

Pukehou Values: Tangata Whenuatanga / Citizenship:

Carrying on from last fortnights education on our value of Manaakitanga /Respect, Tangata Whenuatanga / Citizenship is this week's focus. What makes a good citizen? We believe good citizens take an interest in their local, national and global community and environment. We aim for our children to understand where they come from, and where they fit into the world around them. Above all we aim to instill a sense of giving to, and helping of others. Another plug from the PHN regarding measles!

Since this outbreak in NZ started there have been over 900 cases and more are getting diagnosed every week. 30%-40% of those cases are needing hospital level care.

A new advisory from National Health Advisory as follows:

Anyone who may have been in contact with someone with measles should check their vaccination status before they travel. People who have early symptoms of measles (fever, cough, runny nose, sore eyes) should not travel.

Parents and caregivers need to be aware of their vaccination status as well. This is not just for our tamariki and rangitahi.

I really feel it's only a matter of time before we are affected and vaccination is the best and the only way to protect ourselves.
