Principal's Message

Ngā mihi nui ki a koutou.

Over the last few weeks there have been a few visual changes here at school with the big poplar and willow tree's coming down on our school field. Both of these trees had become a significant safety risk with large branches falling regularly and significant rot appearing. A huge thank you to Kahotea Farming and Awakeri Drainage for the donation of their time and machinery to take care of this task. We are currently working on a replanting plan with the aim to plant replacement trees in Autumn 2020.

Thankfully this week the initial stages of the new PWF funded shade sails has also taken place, to replace the shade available to our students in the summer months. We are incredibly thankful for all the work that our PWF have put in over the year to be able to purchase a large shade sail over the sandpit area in front of Kāhu. They have also been successful in securing a grant from New Zealand Community Trust to replace the old sails over the playground and in front of the office. We look forward to the new sails being in place by the end of November.

This week saw the very first time that Poukawa and Pukehou schools have combined for Athletics. It was wonderful to see so many students participate to the very best of their ability and to see our students pushed, through competition with another school. As with any event there are areas for improvement. We are currently working through an improvement plan for next year to ensure that all rotations can be completed with the limited amount of time and larger cohort numbers that we had.

Bus Changes:

School Donations Scheme

This year the government announced the introduction of the School Donations Scheme which entitles Decile 1-7 state and state integrated Boards of Trustees the ability to choose to receive a \$150 per student, per year payment instead of seeking donations from parents. Our Board of Trustees recently minuted that decision and we are pleased to announce we will be a part of the scheme for 2020. Although donations to schools are voluntary, families can feel under pressure to pay them and this can place pressure on household budgets. This initiative is designed to alleviate that pressure and expectation. It also recognises that Decile 1-7 schools can find it difficult to raise funds from their communities.

There are some exemptions from this scheme such as sports fees, which parents elect for their children to participate in, along with overnight camps where we will still request a donation from parents.
