Principal's Message

Ngā mihi nui ki a koutou.

What a busy few weeks we have had here at Pukehou. Our students are being kept extremely busy both in and out of the classroom, with many sporting events taking place. The school swimming pool is up and running and the focus of the classroom programs remain. Slowly our focus will shift towards the end of year break up and of course the summer holidays are only four weeks away.

I/we need your help! The Support Staff at Pukehou do an amazing job keeping the school running, taking care of the needs of your children and supporting our teachers. Sadly, our Support Staff (our treasures - Jacqui, Meg, Kelly and Amber) do not get a fair deal. Support Staff are funded from school Operations Grants. Over the years, the cost of running a school keeps going up. Power, phone, insurance and maintenance costs keep escalating, yet our Operations Grants' have barely risen to cover these costs. Our wonderful Support Staff are currently in negotiation with the Government, requesting a much needed pay rise, along with pay equity. 90% of Support

Staff across New Zealand earn below the current living wage (\$21.15) This is the wage that it is believed necessary for workers and their families to provide the **basic** necessities of life if working a full time job (most School Support Staff only work part time in NZ during term time). Below is a link to a NZEI open letter to Minister Hipkins that I request you sign to support the heroes of our school and school's across New Zealand. They deserve to be recognised for the valuable contribution that they provide to our tamariki, your children. Every school needs these wonderful people. Our call is for the Government to fund Support Staff properly (through Government staffing) and ensure they are paid fairly for the wonderful job that they all do. This year's White Ribbon campaign is focused around #UnspokenRules

Unspoken Rules are the expectations that boys and young men inherit from society, based on outdated ideas of what a man is, how he acts, and how he should express himself.

Even if we don't agree with them, these rules still exist silently in the background for far too many. Rules like Be the Man, Toughen Up and Boys Don't Cry reinforce unhelpful stereotypes about what it is to be a man.

These unspoken rules put pressure on boys and young men to behave in certain ways and dismiss behaviours perceived as "unmanly", leading them to suppress their emotions and their individuality.

This affects how our boys and young men feel about themselves, and how they treat others. It affects how they approach their relationships, and can lead them to act disrespectfully – even violently – toward their partners.

We have the opportunity to use our voices as parents, caregivers and influencers to speak up over the #unspokenrules. By saying out loud to our boys and young men that it's OK for them to be who they are, we can encourage them to define themselves as men who have respectful relationships – protecting our whole community.


Our 4 school chickens are laying well and we regularly have a full box of eggs for sale - for
