Principal's Message

Ngā mihi nui ki a koutou.

It is wonderful to have everyone back after the school holidays. Smiling happy faces are always a joy and it is wonderful to see. As I write the sun is shining and wind is blowing, hopefully the field will dry out shortly to enable the students more space for running around and burning off all that pent up energy after the wet holidays.

Parents, Caregivers you may find the following hard to read, but I urge you to! It is in your child's best interest to be brave.

Our sensitive topics in our Health, Navigating the Journey (human development) curriculum have begun here at school. For many (parents/caregivers) this can be a confronting topic, believe me, some of the conversations are not easy for staff either. We need to face the facts. Our children are growing up in a very different environment to that, which we grew up in. All schools across CHB are following this same programme (although at different times) and all are encountering the same findings in their student groups. Our children know more, see more and hear more than we would hope they would, and from an earlier age than we would have thought. You only have to look at our parliament in the last few weeks, listen to the radio or watch the six o'clock news to see, hear and recognise our children are exposed to a lot of subjects that we would never have discussed, or have been exposed to, as children ourselves. Yet, daily our children are bombarded with information, images and messages on tv, radio, internet and in conversations with their friends. This is why we, and other schools, have adopted this programme, to assist our children in making sense of the world around them. We need to give them the right information and to teach them how to keep themselves safe.

We need your help with this.

The conversations in the classrooms are only the start, we need you to follow these up at home. Every family has different beliefs, values and expectations. Your children have questions, we need you to assist in helping answer them. Every few days your child's teacher will share what is and has been covered in each class via the Seesaw classroom account. Please read what has been covered and take time to sit with your child, listen and talk, to help them process what they have learnt. We may want to believe that they are too young to understand some of these topics, however, they know and are seeking information. Let it come from you, not their friends or the internet. Be brave, be there for your child and talk to them about your family values, beliefs and expectations. On behalf of the Pukehou team and your child, we thank you!
