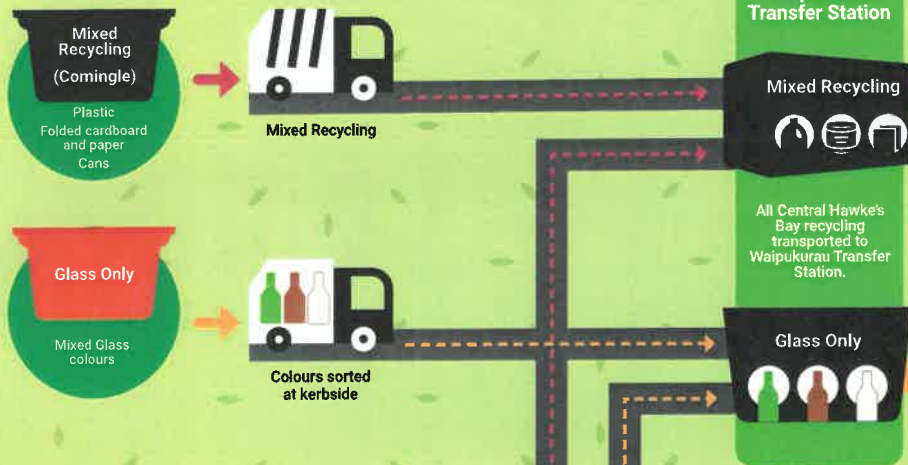

Kerbside Collections

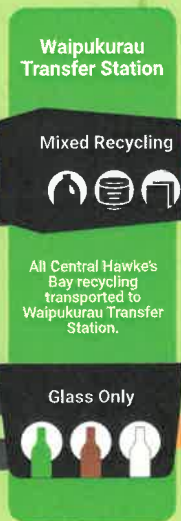
Please make sure your recycling is clean, in the correct Council container, and at the kerb by 7.30am on your day of collection!

Recyclables

- Baled and shipped to be reprocessed into other plastic products, like food containers or clothes pegs, fence posts and garden seats.
- Cardboard and paper are made into new paper products like fruit trays, cardboard boxes and containers.
- Scrap Metal Dealers → Processed into cans and other metal products like hand tools, cans and containers.

Non-recyclables - including plastics

Plastics 3, 4, 6 and 7 are no longer able to be recycled in New Zealand.

District Landfill Central Hawke's Bay

Glass recycling is crushed, melted and remoulded into new glass bottles or jars.
