Principal's Message:

The holidays were a great time to reset and refresh after what was a tricky term punctuated by a constantly changing landscape. It was extremely evident that our tamariki were excited to be back at school, settling quickly back into routine and focusing on their learning. While we remain vigilant, it is great that this term there will be opportunities for our students to reconnect outside of the classroom and school. Likewise, it has been fantastic to welcome parents and whānau through the gate!

Thank you to those who contributed to our survey on what our value of Whanaungatanga-relationships means to them. Your voice provided a rich source of information that complemented and added to our kete here at school. A 'rubric' has been developed with some key statements designed to describe how students show this at school. It will be shared widely with our school families once we have unpacked it further. A similar process will be followed this term as we explore Oranga Hauora - Healthy Living.

As part of our focus on Hauora, classes have begun their Pause-Breathe-Smile journey. Whenever you get the opportunity, please talk to your child/ren about this. Teachers have been impressed by how our tamariki have come on board with the activities so far. Next week, during the lead up to Pink Shirt Day we will have a week of fun 'pink' activities focused on a bully-free NZ. Our Year 7-8 students will also visit CHB College for Discovery Day next week which is exciting too!

We have been fortunate to receive support from the 'Designers in Schools' programme for the Edible Fashion Awards this year. This will see Keryn Whitney working with a group of passionate senior students weekly to mentor them through the process culminating in the Designer Showcase on the 25th of August. We have some amazingly creative students and I can't wait to see how their designs develop.

This year sees the introduction of a Matariki public holiday on Friday 24th June. For the week leading up to this we will take the opportunity to explore and celebrate Matariki. Teachers are beginning to plan for this and we will keep our families informed about how you can support, contribute to, and share in the celebrations. At this stage, we are planning for Kōtare and Kāhu to visit Poukawa School for a Ki o Rahi tournament!! If you have any suggestions or ideas about how you could help, please contact your child's teacher or the office.

Student Conferences will occur in the final week of the term on Wednesday the 6th and Thursday the 7th of July. Mid-Year reports will be given at this time. Leading up to this, HERO learning stories will 'go live' meaning parents will be able to access them. Writing will be at the end of week 6, mathematics week 7, and reading week 8. Again, if you haven't already, we would encourage all parents to sign up to **HERO**. If you are struggling to do so, please contact either myself or Jacqui. Teachers will be carrying out a range of different assessments in the next couple of weeks, and while some students often feel anxious, we always reinforce the point that the purpose of assessment is to inform our teaching so we know what needs to be taught.



It was great to see winter sports kick off last weekend, and I know some more codes will begin this weekend. I did manage to get to see some mini-ball, and was impressed with how well our Pukehou School teams played and how well they represented Pukehou School. I can't wait to see more as the term progresses, and I'm sure our students will shine.

Our amazing Pukehou Whānau & Friends (PWF) group are meeting on the 23rd of May, and I know they would welcome anyone who wishes to help. This term, thanks to their efforts, we are providing music exploration on Mondays for all our students. They have loved the first two sessions with Danny, and it's great to see them all exploring their creative sides with music! Our junior playground has also been topped up with bark through the support of the PWF, and it was awesome to have a number of students volunteer to spread it. They worked hard and we had some fun doing so!

If your arrangements unexpectedly change in any way, please let us know.




Coming back to Hawke's Bay!





Welcome back Mary, our cleaner, who was with us for 5 years until 2016 and couldn't wait to return! We're delighted to see you again.




