Principal's Message:

Mānawati a Matariki! It has been fantastic to see Matariki increasingly recognised and celebrated far and wide. Here at school, our community celebration was an amazing success, and it was wonderful to reopen our gates and reconnect with our school whanau and the community. Our Year 7-8 boys (tama) were undoubtedly the 'stars'. They have grown individually and collectively over the term by participating in a Mana Enhancement programme facilitated by Dwayne Hapuku. Because of this, they were able to prepare and lay a hangi that catered for over 160 people...a huge effort by anyone's standards!! All the food was generously donated from our school community...a phenomenal effort, and the consensus was that it was delicious!! Whanau were then able to wander through 'The Peace Path' in reflection, guided by Matariki lanterns from each classroom. It was a humbling yet uplifting night.

Continuing on with celebrations saw Pukehou and Poukawa Schools come together for an exchange. Our two senior classes were hosted by Poukawa for a Ki o Rahi tournament, and we reciprocated by hosting the Poukawa junior classes with students mingling to participate in a range of activities. We were fortunate with the weather, and it was great to see children from both schools coming together: whanaungatanga! We are keen to develop and expand our relationship with Poukawa further. Not only do we have a number of similarities, there is a shared history through Ngā Puna-a-Tara and the taonga that were the lakes Poukawa, Roto-a-Kiwa, Roto-a-Tara (opposite Pukehou School), and Whatumā.

At the end of last term, we distributed a survey on our value of Whanaungatanga - Relationships. As a result of the information received we developed a simple rubric identifying what that might look like in school. The points included within are in effect success criteria and could become specific teaching points.
