Mid-year Progress Reporting to our Community

Student achievement was a focus at our board meeting last week. The mid-year achievement results presented by Rob and his team looked great – particularly given the disruptions we have all faced this year. The overall targets for maths, reading and writing were all exceeded with more than 80% of students working 'at' or 'above' curriculum level expectations. The board also considers results in terms of gender, ethnicity and those that may need extra extension or support.

Looking at the details, we can see some terrific individual achievements as students progress along their learning path. As always these reports are also useful for highlighting areas where we need to re-focus our resources. Maths has traditionally been a strong area for Pukehou and in the last few years we have also seen an improvement in literacy following the ALL (Accelerating Learning in Literacy) programme. That success is now being embedded further with our adoption of Structured Literacy – a summary of this programme was included with reports at the end of last term. While 22% of students are 'well above' curriculum expectations for reading, work in the second half of the year will focus on supporting those that are still working towards their expected level in reading. We also hope to increase the number of students working at 'well above' for maths and writing.

We are lucky to have a great team of teachers working with Rob to ensure all ākonga are learning to the best of their abilities. I know the teachers appreciated meeting with many of you kanohi ki te kanohi at the end of term two to talk about how your tamariki are doing – good communication between home and school is a key part of ensuring our students' success.
