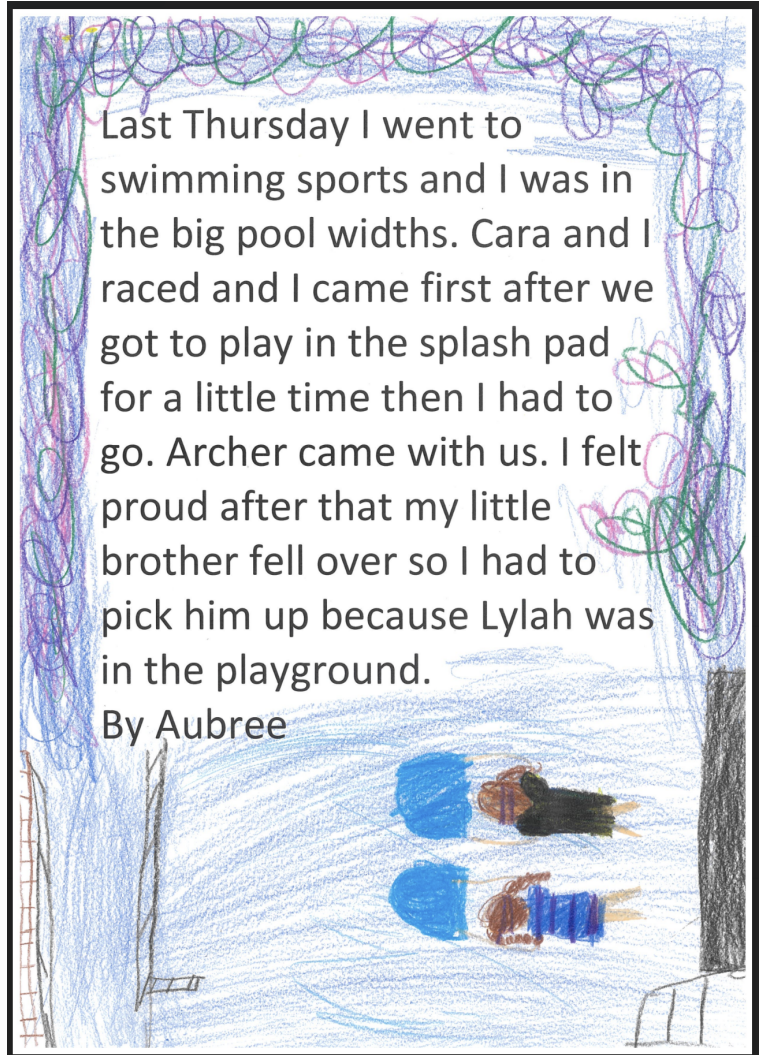

SWIM-4-LIVES – SWIM-A-THON

We had a great session on the evening of Friday the 24th and although the number of swimmers was down a bit on other years they still managed to swim a combined

distance of **11km** and **raise \$3,800 dollars** to help support the Swim-4-Lives programme – **The Goal being to provide Deep Water Safety and 10 Swimming Lessons for all CHB Primary school aged children.** The programme is mainly centred around the Centralines Pool Complex in Waipukurau but also incorporates the Memorial Pool in Waipawa and some schools pools.

- The cost to cover the instructors and the buses to transport the children into the Centralines Pool is around \$80,000 – The ongoing support we get for the Swim-A-Thons is fantastic but we were not getting close to raising the funds needed to support our Goal, so the group applied for grants.
- We have been very fortunate to receive grants from the following organisations, which we very much appreciate and we would like to acknowledge them for supporting this programme for all CHB Primary School aged tamariki.

○ Tē Manawa Active Aotearoa – through Sport HB	\$15,000
○ Centralines	\$15,000
○ Eastern and Central Community Trust	\$41,845
- The logistics of getting all primary schools and Kura means the programme is implemented over a two-year timeline which we started in Term 4 2022.
- **Once again we are very grateful for the support from all the swimmers (and their sponsors), their supporters, the volunteers and the donations received from local businesses and also the big funding organisations.**
