#### One hour a day!

From the beginning of Term 1 2024, under the new Government's first 100 days plan, schools are expected to spend an average of one hour a day teaching each reading, writing, and maths. This could be in dedicated lessons and in other learning areas as students read, write, and engage with maths in a variety of purposes and contexts.

Learning to read, write, and do maths is important in everything we do here at Pukehou School. Both the Board and our teaching team have reviewed policy and are confident that we are meeting our obligations. The way our day is structured, naturally lends itself to explicit blocks of instruction in these areas. Each day starts with Structured Literacy which incorporates aspects of both reading and writing. After a 'brain break' and some read 'n' feed (where the teacher shares a book with students as they eat brainfood), we move into a longer Literacy Block which allows for explicit instruction in both. Following morning tea, there is a solid hour block set aside for Numeracy (mathematics). More about our maths programme is shared later on.

We also recognise the need for balance. Students still need to be active and they need to explore, investigate and express themselves in inquiry, science, and the arts. Literacy and numeracy is integrated into these areas too. And for our younger students, play, to develop oral language and social skills, is vitally important. As Murray Gadd (a writing guru) said, reading and writing float on a sea of oral language.

#### Whakawhanaungatanga

As I write this, I'm at a Ministry of Education curriculum lead session. One of the first discussion points in our group was

"He aha he mahi e kaka ake ai tō tātou hapori? What would make our community stronger?" This is something that is vitally important, and something that we have discussed as a Board recently. Partnership is necessary for success, and we'd love to know from you what we can do as a school to help build community.

Finally, I'm super excited to be heading off to camp with Kāhu class to Aramoana next week. Rachael (Mrs. Strong) has been working tirelessly to organise it, and I'm sure we'll have a blast. I can't wait to get to know our senior students even better outside of the classroom and see how they come together as a team.

may be aware, PRIME Mathematics makes up the core of our teaching and learning programme for mathematics at Pukehou School. And while we've been using it for some time, the programme has been refreshed and revamped and we're pretty excited by the changes!

For some background, PRIME Mathematics is a structured programme that builds a solid foundation in mathematics by developing deep conceptual understanding with a strong focus on problem-solving. It is an evidence-based programme that combines the standards and best practices of top-performing education systems, such as Singapore and Hong Kong, against international benchmarks on mathematics achievement.

The PRIME Mathematics programme is sequenced so that new concepts are regularly revisited, reinforced and built upon to enable your child to confidently move to the next step. It is fully aligned with the New Zealand Curriculum, PRIME Mathematics ensures effective teaching and learning for your child, allowing your child's teacher to constantly monitor their mathematical reasoning and adjust the teaching to suit their needs. Teachers are able to provide valuable and immediate feedback on whether students have mastered the concept. Misconceptions and errors can be quickly addressed.

We also recognise that for students just starting out in school, there is a need for materials and hands-on tasks to help develop mathematical thinking and understanding. PRIME has developed a range of 'big books' to cater to this need.

This year PRIME has introduced the Maths Pro online platform to support the teaching of the core curriculum. It provides instructional resources, independent learning activities and assessment with real time, actionable insights for student understanding and progress.

Not only has the content been refreshed but levels and Course Books have been consolidated. For example, where there used to be a 2A and a 2B there is now just a 2. We recognise that these are costly but we strongly believe in the effectiveness of PR1ME. In the near future we would like to hold an information session for interested parents and whānau, but in the meantime, if you have any queries, please feel free to contact any of the teaching team here at school.

## Tele-health service introduced in Central Hawke's Bay

There will be a new way to access after-hours healthcare in Central Hawke's Bay from Monday - a rural

telehealth service. Waipukurau GPs have provided after-hours healthcare for years, including weekend clinics, but with a shortage of available GPs and difficulty recruiting new ones, it has been decided it is time to apply the rural telehealth service in Central Hawke's

The service was launched nation-wide last year to assist rural practices where access to general practitioners is limited

The service, which operates from 5pm to 8am weekdays, and 24 hours on weekends and on public holidays, can be accessed by calling 0800 2KA ORA (0800 252 672).

The number will be answered by a nurse, and if further advice is needed a nurse practitioner or GP can be contacted. If a prescription is required, this can be supplied via the telehealth service.

Face-to-face consultation. required, can also be arranged via telehealth.

There is no charge for a nurse consultation, however, payment is required if a further telehealth consultation with a clinician is needed.

If a patient has a Community

Services Card or is over 65, they will

be charged a lower fee (\$19.50).

There is no charge for children





