Maths Fast Tracking

As you are aware there have been some major announcements lately as the Government has moved to fast track the refreshed and revised Maths Curriculum. Sadly, the accompanying rhetoric has been framed to undermine schools and the teaching profession. Teachers and school leaders go to work every day to support your children to succeed. Students in our country are among the best in the world for creative thinking, achieve in the top dozen countries in Reading and Science and score above the average of other OECD countries in Maths. New Zealand Council for Educational Research's (NZCER) Dr Charles Darr, one of the lead researchers involved in the study quoted by the Government, says: "We've been tracking student achievement in mathematics at Year 8 for more than ten years, and in that time, there has been no evidence for improvement or decline."

What we know from our own experience and the research is that every child is unique. The work of a teacher is to use a whole toolbox of skills and expertise to personalise the learning that will best meet each child's needs.

The real crisis we are facing in our schools is not teaching and learning, but a crisis of funding and resourcing. A major barrier to us meeting the needs of every child currently is the lack of resourcing for learning support.. At least three in 10 students who need learning support nationally are currently not getting it. The government has indicated that this is an area they will be looking closely at. Increased learning support is impeartive.

As shared earlier in the year, we have invested in the PR1ME maths resource as the foundation of our Maths curriculum. PR1ME Mathematics is a structured programme that builds a solid foundation in mathematics by developing deep conceptual understanding with a strong focus on problem-solving. It is an evidence-based programme that combines the standards and best practices of top-performing education systems, such as Singapore and Hong Kong, against international benchmarks on mathematics achievement. While we wait to see what the new curriculum will bring, we are confident that PR1ME is meeting the needs of our learners at present so they become numerate members of society in the future.

Progress and Achievement Reporting

Teachers constantly monitor student progress throughout the year to inform their teaching and learning programmes and practice. Prior to reporting at the end of last term, teachers made an Overall Teacher Judgement (OTJ) to identify what level students are currently working at. These OTJs are used to provide a picture of achievement across the school which is analysed and evaluated by the teaching team and the Board to identify trends and patterns and where extra support and resourcing might be needed.

The Pukehou School Board has an aspirational target, aiming for 80% of our students to be meeting or exceeding their curriculum level expectation in Reading, Writing, and Maths. Our mid-year data indicates that 65% of students are meeting or exceeding expectations in Reading, 64% in Writing, and 71% in Maths. It is worth noting in Reading that 33% are above or well above expectations, and in Maths that figure is 18%!

Through discussions between the teaching team and again at Board level, the **impact of attendance on progress** and achievement cannot be overlooked. It is a key contributing factor. For schools across the country, Term 2 reflected lower attendance due to the effect of winter illnesses. While we recognise that absence through illness is both inevitable and necessary, we would again like to emphasise the importance of regular attendance. **#getthere**

In Reading, Writing, and Maths, there are a key group of students working towards expectations (27.3%, 24.8%, and 19.5%). We are confident that, through good teaching focused on individual needs and regular attendance, many of these students can meet expectations by the end of the year.

It takes a village to raise a child, and we appreciate the support that our parents and whānau provide. Learning underpinned by a strong home and school partnership will lead to more success. There are many simple ways you can support your child's <u>learning at home</u>. By simply showing an interest in their learning, sharing a book, or discussing every day tasks you can help your child learn.
