Building Works

Over the term break, the team from Turfreys worked hard to install our upgraded waste water system. Sadly this saw the removal of our 'bottle house.' On the bright side, it did see some large piles of soil left behind as a result. Our students are very keen to develop this into a bike 'pump' styled track which we'd love to see happen too! So if you have some expertise in this area or are able to help in some way we'd love to hear from you. Ideally we'd like to action this as soon as possible...a working bee this term maybe?



Further works should be happening this term with the building of new sheds by our water tanks and the relocation of our container closer to the tanks. This will open up our school frontage nicely. It would be great down the track to design a mural for the container as it will be highly visible to traffic on SH2.

We have also been advised that we have a small amount of funding to go towards a learning space. The teaching team all agreed that we'd love to use this to develop an outdoor learning space where curiosity can flourish!

Hall - We haven't yet received the designs for our hall upgrade as they are still being peer reviewed. The indications though are that this project will start later in the year .

Reporting

As you are aware, schools are in the process of changing from the old curriculum to the new curriculum for Maths in Years 0-8 and English in Years 0-6 [English in Years 7-13 is still in the consultation phase].

This includes new content, progressions and expectations for each year group. Because of this, you could see a change in your child's progress and achievement compared to previous years.

A combination of tools will be used to make 'overall teacher judgements' on a child's progress including assessment, observations and classroom tasks.

As part of this, the expectations for learning areas in our **HERO** student management system will need to be changed too, with some of the data for the 2007 Curriculum expectations archived. We will keep you informed of this process and prior to reports going home will provide an explanation of the changes that have occured and any impact they may cause.
