What a fantastic day we had last week when the whole school travelled to Central Hawke's Bay College to enjoy the touring Science Roadshow. It was a real treat to watch our tamariki so engaged — they took part in two brilliant lessons that explored the impact we as humans have on the environment and our clean water supply, and another that demonstrated vacuum and forces. The presenters made tricky ideas accessible and exciting, and our students asked thoughtful questions throughout.

After the lessons, the children had a chance to get hands-on with numerous scientific displays. It was wonderful to see them experiment, explore and collaborate — many students were completely captivated from start to finish. Their curiosity and enthusiasm were a joy to witness, and their respectful behaviour was a credit to our school.

Back at school the excitement continued in the discovery playground, where students worked together to build creations some of which were inspired by the show. Seeing groups design and construct imaginative projects — including the flying machine shown on the next page — was a delight and a perfect example of learning in action.

Thank you to our teachers and parent helpers for making the trip possible, and to our students for their excellent behaviour and eager participation. Experiences like this spark a love of learning that will stay with our children for a long time.

With only two weeks of the term remaining, I have become aware of the many activities that will be occurring in this short time-frame. Over the next two weeks all our students and staff will be fully involved in our school Production preparations. The show is coming together well, and Mrs Strong continues to energise us with her passion and enthusiasm. Next week on Wednesday we have some of our students competing in the CHB Schools Mathletics competition, which I am keen to attend. On Friday the 12th September school will be closed as teachers will be involved in a TEACHER ONLY DAY with many teachers from Central Hawke's Bay schools focused on the new Mathematics curriculum.

During the final week of the term we will be busy transporting some of our students on Tuesday to Hastings to compete in the Hawke's Bay Inter-school cross country championships. Then on Thursday we have entered four teams into the Central Hawke's Bay Rippa Rugby Tournament. Our teams have been practising during breaks and look very sharp to compete.




### **READ TO SUCCEED!**
